First movie to be transmitted over the Internet cult movie *Wax: Or the Discovery of Television Among the Bees* in 1993. ½ the resolution of a standard definition television in black and white. 1995, a short film called the Spirit of Christmas by Trey Parker and Matt Stone - one of <u>first viral videos</u> - 15 MB - 2 hours over 56k modem. <u>Growth of cable channels 79 in '89 to 171 in '98</u>. Costs kept rising dramatically to cover the costs of programming/infrastructure upgrades.

ISP speeds increased. 15MB file download speeds (1hr12min > 37min > 8/4/2/1min > 12sec > 1 sec). Alternative and homemade content.

So many options - what paying for? 5 of 10 most requested channels are free (ABC, CBS, NBC, Fox, PBS). Most expensive channels not even in top 15 (ESPN/Sports and Fox News/Political). 50% would drop ESPN. Can't subscribe/drop channels a la carte. Inventive ways to get what's needed.

According to a report number of cord cutters has tripled over the last 5 years to 14.1 million households who only receive over-the-top streaming services. 15 million households that rely exclusively on an antenna to receive free broadcast channels. The rate of growth of cord-cutting adopters are enough to make television executives a little nervous.

iTV first to stream movies (later podcast episode), then Netflix. Showed the world streaming could work - massive scale.
